

## Fairfield Civic League Meeting Minutes

April 9, 2018

The meeting was brought to order at 7:05 pm by Doug McLiverty, who led the group in the Pledge of Allegiance. Doug introduced our guest speaker, Cheryl Turpin, elected member of the Virginia House of Delegates representing the 85<sup>th</sup> District that includes the Fairfield precinct. Delegate Turpin said it was an honor to serve and be a part of the Virginia General Assembly which is described as "the oldest continuous law-making body in the New World". She spoke about the Virginia Capitol building itself as an inspiring work of historical architecture designed by Thomas Jefferson. Delegate Turpin, who has been a teacher for 24 years, was appointed to the Education Committee, High School Subcommittee of the General Assembly. She is also a member of the Privileges and Elections Committee. Delegate Turpin explained some of the legislative processes required to have bills considered, passed, failed and carried over. She provided attendees a handout of the 2018 Session Highlights and opened the floor to any questions. Following the discussion Delegate Turpin provided her contact information and invited anyone who has a concern to please contact her.
